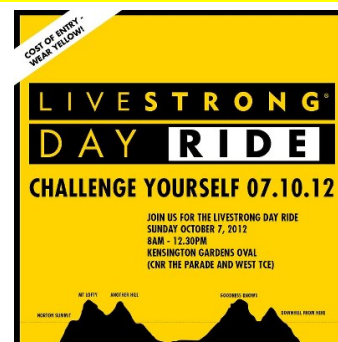
### Upcoming Events:

Ashleigh Moore presented two sessions at the Australian Radiography Institute Conference in Adelaide on 11 Aug 2012. (Photo, left to right: Ashleigh Moore, Eileen Giles, Dr Sue Merchant, Donna Matthews.)

He described to radiotherapists his recent personal experience of travelling to Sydney for 5 weeks for 4D gated stereotactic radiotherapy, and later, to 200

radiologists and radiotherapists, he talked about Cancer Voices and the role of patient advocates in radiotherapy.

While Ashleigh was in Sydney in July having radiotherapy treatment, he gave another talk to Royal North Shore Hospital Radiotherapy staff about his work through Cancer Voices.

New! [Cancer Survival and prevalence in Australia](#) – a report produced by the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare ([www.aihw.gov.au](http://www.aihw.gov.au)). A new statistic: conditional relative survival, illustrates the survival prospects for individuals who have already survived a given number of years after their cancer diagnosis. See the example for lung cancer below.

**Table 4.42: Summary of conditional relative survival from lung cancer, Australia, 2006–2010**

Years already survived	5-year conditional relative survival	
	CS (%)	95% CI
At diagnosis	14.1	13.7–14.5
Already survived 1 year after diagnosis	33.6	31.4–35.8
Already survived 5 years after diagnosis	72.3	70.4–74.2
Already survived 10 years after diagnosis	81.4	79.0–83.7

News! **Breakthrough blood test for bowel cancer.** Researchers working within the Flinders Centre for Innovation in Cancer's ACRF Cancer Prevention Unit have developed a breakthrough blood test to detect colorectal cancer in collaboration with CSIRO and Clinical Genomics Pty Ltd.
